WHAT IS TRANSITION YEAR?

"Transition Year is a one year school based programme between Junior and Senior Cycle. It is designed to act as a bridge between the two by facilitating the smooth transition from the more **dependant learning** of the Junior Cycle to the more **independent self-directed learning** required for the Senior Cycle"

WHY DO TRANSITION YEAR?

- > Provides students with the opportunity to develop their individual gifts and strengths.
- Promotes the holistic development of our students by building confidence, self-esteem, independence and maturity. It encourages both personal and social development.
- They experience a year where the emphasis is on individual responsibility for study and self directed work. They develop as an independent and self motivated learner.
- > Provides a year free of exam pressure where the TY programme is **learning led** rather than exam led.
- > They prepare for the adult world through work experience (If possible) and workplace certification.
- Participate in a variety of subjects, workshops & activities. It gives the student the opportunity to do most of the subjects available for the Leaving Certificate, thus helping them to make an informed choice.
